Dayton Chapter History

Tom Homan followed as president for the years of 1987 to 1988. Tom is the nephew of Jack Homan, who was the president of Allied Supply and highly involved with ASHVE back in the 1950s before the two Societies joined to form ASHRAE. Tom is now the president of Allied Supply and still a major supporter of Dayton ASHRAE.



Tom had big shoes to follow but he did a great job. The first major change was to move back to the Engineers Club for the monthly meetings. Again many of the meetings included an additional one hour technical meeting prior to the Happy Hour. The Roster indicates that there were 48 individuals and companies that invested in ASHRAE Research. Programs included a typical joint meeting with the Cincinnati Chapter at the Holiday Inn in Sharonville, along with technical meetings on Indoor Air Quality, and banning fluorocarbons by Jim Cox who was ASHRAE's Director of Government Affairs in Washington DC and ended with a sports program with Gordy Coleman of the Cincinnati Reds. Tom's quote back in 1987 is similar to today's thoughts and needs, "As Dayton's leading professional Society, our strong program, strong meeting attendance and camaraderie among our local members is the backbone of our Society. Your involvement is the key and I hope you'll give of yourself to meet the challenges of technology and human destiny our industry faces".

Tom indicated that some of his most memorable ASHRAE experiences were as president. "I had to stretch my abilities and do things that I was not comfortable in doing. The good things were the warm greetings received from the older members and the fun and laughs from getting to know other members. The Board use to joke about the "4H" Club of Helmig, Huff, Hawkinberry and Homan. Highlights also included a very successful phone committee headed by Steve Stanitzke, free beer, liquor raffles, organized check lists for a successful meeting, well run student events and PAOE points handled by Lorraine Kapka and Al Watton. the mini ASHRAE show with attendance over 30, average meeting attendance was 122."

Tom is a graduate of the University of Cincinnati with a B.B.A. in business and a minor in finance. Tom is the third generation of the Homan Family to run Allied Supply Company, Inc. and has been involved in the business for the last 39 years. In 2010 they will celebrate 75 years in business.

Allied Supply's history goes back to 1935 when John L. Homan, Tom's grandfather, a welder for Frigidaire, founded Allied Supply. John saw the potential growth in the developing refrigeration business and, with two partners, Bob and L.O. Warner, he began rebuilding compressors and ice cream cabinet coils, did refrigeration service and sold parts and supplies to other servicemen. In 1935 he sold his interest in the Service business to L.O. Warner, a dominant contractor in its prime. Jack Homan, a 1943 mechanical engineer and mathematician graduated from UD and took over as president in 1952. Bill Homan was elected president in 1971, J.W (Jim) Homan became president in 1985 and Tom in 2005. Over the years they expanded to Lima, Mansfield, Toledo and Cincinnati markets. Their success as a full line wholesaler of HVAC, Controls and Filtration belongs in part to the "greatest generation" World War II veterans of which Allied was fortunate to have eight, who retired from the company with each over 43 years of service. Many will remember Jack Powel, the Dayton branch Manager and also active in Dayton ASHRAE.
